

Marbled Paper!

YOU'LL NEED: SHAVING CREAM, PAPER PLATE, FOOD COLORING, PAPER, PIECE OF CARDBOARD

1. SHAVING CREAM

- Spray a layer of shaving cream on a paper plate. This project can get a bit messy, so you might want to do it on a plastic sheet or easy-to-clean surface.
- Add drops of food coloring around the plate. Use a toothpick or popsicle stick to gently stir the color into the shaving cream. You want to make nice swirly patterns- so stop before the colors completely blend together!



2. IMPRINT

- Gently place a piece of paper on top of the shaving cream. Press it down lightly from corner to corner. When you lift off the paper, it will be covered in shaving cream.
- Use a stiff piece of cardboard or plastic to scrape the shaving cream off (try scraping right into the garbage can to make it less messy). The dye will stay behind, leaving patterns on your paper.

3. EXPERIMENT

- You can use the same tray of shaving cream for several pieces of paper, just add a few more drops of food coloring if you need more color.
- Your patterns will look different depending on how much food coloring you use, and how you mix in the dye. Try different techniques and see what you like best!
- Let your paper dry for about an hour. It's pretty artwork on its own, or you can use it in another craft--like a Unicorn Wand!
