While registration is occurring now, people can also sign up for the Summer Reading Program on Friday, June 1 during the “Reading Rocks in Waukeee” event. Members of the public are invited to stop by the Waukeee Public Library either from 10-11 a.m. or from 4-5 p.m. to paint a rock and sign up for the program. This is a come-and-go event. Participants are encouraged to put the rocks on display somewhere out in the Waukeee community.
